## **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

### **Midsummer Concert 2011**

CNS members will note elsewhere in this Newsletter that for the second year in a row, the CNS is sponsoring a Midsummer Concert featuring representative classical music from each of the five Nordic countries. We are undertaking this concert in partnership with the embassies of Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland and Iceland.

The concert will take place on Saturday, June 11, 2011 at Dominion Chalmers United Church starting at 8:00 p.m. Once again this program will be performed by the Chamber Players of Canada with its Artistic Director, Julian Armour. This year's program of music is featured on the poster on our front cover.

CNS members will be interested to know that the Midsummer Concert represents the eighth and final performance of the 2010-2011 concert series as performed by the Chamber Players of Canada. Some in the Ottawa concert community have already bought tickets for the Midsummer Concert as part of a series package.

The Midsummer Concert has two target audiences:

1. Naturally, the Scandinavian community in the Ottawa area. We have reserved some 350 tickets for members of CNS and other Scandinavian sister organizations, such as the Canadian Friends of Finland, Danish Club, Friends of Iceland, Swedish Club, and others.
2. Those in the greater Ottawa community interested in classical music from the Nordic countries. For those, we work with our Chamber Players partners, as well with contacts in the Ottawa media.

We will be contacting each member of the Canadian Nordic Society about purchasing a ticket. I would ask that each CNS member support this concert by buying at least one ticket. Ticket prices for a concert of this professional level are very reasonable. Even if you are unable to attend, we ask that you purchase a ticket anyway and give it to a friend.

This Midsummer Concert represents the biggest undertaking ever attempted by the Canadian Nordic Society. It does provide us with an opportunity to establish a cultural event with a Scandinavian flavour during the Ottawa summer music schedule. It enables the general public to become familiar with Nordic music, which exactly accords with our mandate to promote a better appreciation of the culture of the Nordic countries.

Moreover, the music that we will be sharing with the Ottawa public will be of the finest quality.
